

ACADEMIC ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN KING COLLEGE AND VIRGINIA HIGHLANDS COMMUNITY COLLEGE

King College and Virginia Highlands Community College recognize the need and importance of facilitating the transfer of students from one institution to the other as they pursue their educational goals. Therefore, King College and Virginia Highlands Community College (VHCC) enter into this agreement for the purpose of articulating policies and procedures governing the matriculation of Virginia Highlands Community College graduates at King College.

1.0 Holders of Associate in Arts and Sciences Degrees

Students who have been certified as earning an associate in arts and sciences degree from Virginia Highlands Community College based on a baccalaureate-oriented sequence of courses are guaranteed admission to King College.

- 1.1 These students will be classified as juniors.
- 1.2 These students will have satisfied all lower division general education requirements of King College except the following:
 - 6 hours of Bible: Students will fulfill the Bible requirements by completing Old and New Testament Surveys at King College.
 - One of the following courses: RELG 100, ENGL 217, HIST 111.
- 1.3 Prior to graduating from King College, students must be able to pass intermediate level language or demonstrate intermediate language proficiency. The language requirement may be satisfied at Virginia Highlands Community College or at King College.
- 1.4 Any courses with a grade below a C will need to be repeated at King College.
- 1.5 Students pursuing a degree in Education have specific requirements for licensure that differ from the normal general education requirements. Therefore, education students are urged to acquaint themselves with the requirements at King College and to consult with their counselors or advisors at VHCC in planning their program and selecting electives.
- 1.6 Students pursuing a degree in Nursing are advised to contact the Transfer Counselor at King College for further information regarding this agreement.

2.0 Transfer Module

Transfer students from VHCC that have taken a baccalaureate-oriented course of study, but have not completed an associate degree will receive credit on a course-by-course basis. Any course with a grade of C or better will be evaluated for credit. In most cases, students will satisfy the majority of lower division general education requirements. Careful program planning at VHCC can result in meeting the general education requirements.
