Send directly to VHCC Admissions Office. It is the student's responsibility to verify with the Admissions Office that transcripts have been received.	
All official college/university transcripts (not required from Virginia Community Colleges)	Applicant requests official transcripts from all college/universities attended sent directly to VHCC Admissions Office. It is the student's responsibility to verify with the Admissions Office that transcripts have been received.	
Achievement of a minimum GPA of 2.0 or higher	From HS or college transcript	
Science	Completion of a high school or college science course with a "C" or better or documented proficiency through GED testing.	
Algebra	Completion of Algebra I with a "C" or better or documented proficiency in Math Modules 1-3.	
Computer Applications	Completion of a high school or college computer applications course with a "C" or better or documented proficiency through completion of computer modules (completed online).	
English	Completion of high school English with a "C" or better or documented proficiency on GED testing - any student who is 6 years post high school must be eligible for ENG 111 (not required to take the course, but must be eligible for the course).	

Once accepted to the program, students must successfully pass both a background check and drug screen to be eligible for the clinical component of the program.
